Key Focus Area: Community Culture

Session Topic: Mesa Grande: An Ancient Treasure in Modern Mesa

Description: Take a tour of the Mesa Grande platform mound built and used by the Ancestral Sonoran Desert People, ancestors of today's Four Southern Nations, between AD 1100 and 1450. The mound was the public and ceremonial center for one of the largest Ancestral Sonoran Desert Peoples villages in the Salt River Valley, a residential area that extended for over one mile along the terrace overlooking the river. The City of Mesa purchased the Mesa Grande ruins in the 1980s to preserve Mesa's premier cultural treasure and to open it to the public as an educational and recreational facility. Learn about this ancient land, and why the City navigated the preservation of its history.
